The Significance of Ugaritic  
for the Study of the Bible

**Gary A. Rendsburg** serves as the Blanche and Irving Laurie Chair of Jewish History at Rutgers University, New Brunswick, N.J., U.S.A. His academic interests include the Bible, the history of the Hebrew language, Semitic languages generally, ancient Egypt, the Dead Sea Scrolls, the Cairo Genizah, and the medieval Hebrew manuscript tradition. On five occasions during the past dozen years, he has served as visiting scholar affiliated with OCHJS (during summers and sabbaticals). His most recent book is *How the Bible Is Written* (2019).
