

OXFORD BIBLICAL HEBREW SUMMER SCHOOL 2022

The Oxford Biblical Hebrew Summer School will take place from August 30 - September 9 2022. This year the school is being offered online (via Zoom). The school offers nine days of intensive teaching in Biblical Hebrew. The course corresponds to two terms of intensive teaching for a full-time university student and is open to students with or without experience of the language.



The cost of the school is £280 per student for 27 hours of language instruction.

The Oxford Biblical Hebrew Summer School will take place from August 30 - September 9 2022. This year the school is being given online (via Zoom).

The school offers nine days of intensive teaching in Biblical Hebrew. Each weekday there will be three hours of teaching, delivered in two separate 90-minute sessions, from 11.30-13.00 and 13.30-15.00 (UK time).

The OBHSS corresponds to two full terms of intensive teaching for a full-time university student. It is open to students with or without experience in the language.

For the former, it offers an opportunity to review and consolidate what they have previously learnt. For the latter, it will provide a strong foundation from which to begin formalized or private study of Biblical Hebrew.
