Nancy Sinkoff is Professor of Jewish Studies and History and the Academic Director of the Allen and Joan Bildner Center for the Study of Jewish Life at Rutgers University. She is author of *From Left to Right: Lucy S. Dawidowicz, the New York Intellectuals, and the Politics of Jewish History* (2020), winner of the fall 2020 Natan Notable Book award and the 2020 National Jewish Book Award in the category of biography; the co-edited volume (with Rebecca Cypess), *Sara Levy’s World: Gender, Judaism, and the Bach Tradition in Enlightenment Berlin* (2018), winner of the outstanding book prize from the Jewish Studies and Music Study Group of the American Musicological Society. Forthcoming is the edited volume, with Halina Goldberg and Natalia Aleksion, *Polish Jewish Culture Beyond the Capital: Centering the Periphery*. Her first book, *Out of the Shtetl: Making Jews Modern in the Polish Borderlands*, was reissued digitally with a new preface (Brown Judaic Studies, 2020).
