

Alla Markova was born and raised in a Jewish family in Leningrad, USSR. She majored in Spanish at the Hertzen Pedagogical University in Leningrad where she combined her interest in Jewish culture and Romance Philology. In the Firkovitch Collection in the State Public Library (now the National Library of Russia) she found over twenty manuscripts in Judeo-Spanish and prepared some of them for publication. In the US, she published Beginner's Ladino, the first manual of Judeo-Spanish for an English-speaking audience.
