Ossnat Sharon Pinto is a scholar of early modern Jewish cultural history. Her research explores the intersection of literature and implicit cultural concepts such as self, space and history. Her MA thesis was completed at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem under the supervision of Professor Galit Hasan-Rokem and Professor Israel Yaacov Yuval (2014). Her PhD dissertation, titled 'The Emergence of the Self in Early Modern Jewish Travelogues: A Literary Perspective', written under the supervision of Professor Dina Stein and Dr Zur Shalev, was completed at Haifa University (2021).

Dr Sharon-Pinto is currently a post-doctoral fellow at *JEWTRACT: Jewish Translation and Cultural Transfer in Early Modern Europe*, an ERC project at Ben-Gurion University.
