CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR VISITING FELLOWSHIPS

Closing Date: 18 November, 12 noon UK Time

The Oxford Centre for Hebrew and Jewish Studies (OCHJS) invites proposals from individuals wishing to undertake a Visiting Fellowship at the OCHJS on a topic related to Hebrew and/or Jewish manuscript studies.

The OCHJS invites applications for its new **Makor Manuscripts Visiting Fellowship** from applicants who are current, established academics and/or postdoctoral researchers working on any aspect of Hebrew and/or Jewish manuscript studies. (Doctoral students are not eligible to apply.) The successful applicant will become a Visiting Fellow of the OCHJS for at least one calendar month during either Oxford University's Hilary Term 2023 or Trinity Term 2023. The Visiting Fellow will be the recipient of a £2,000 honorarium.

Proposals, in no more than 2 pages, should include the following information:

1. Title of Project
2. Description of subject
3. Research methods to be used
4. Possibilities for innovation through the research project
5. Reasons why Oxford is particularly appropriate as the venue for the research, including titles of materials that might be consulted as part of the project
6. Value of the project for the development of Jewish Studies as an academic subject
7. Outcomes of the project (e.g., articles, book chapters, etc.)

Please attach a **curriculum vitae** and **publication list** in addition to the proposal. Additionally, please ensure that **1 academic letter of reference** is submitted directly to the Academic Registrar (details below) by email *before the application deadline*. The responsibility for ensuring said letter of reference is submitted rests solely with the applicant.

The OCHJS will inform applicants following the deadline which projects have been selected for further consideration and then may request further information from applicants before the final decision is made and announced in December.
