This presentation provides an overview of the Judeo-Iranian languages and their current situation in Iran, with a particular focus on Judeo-Hamadani. The presentation explores the idea that Jews in cities in central and western Iran preserved their former vernacular language, while the majority of the population replaced it with Persian during the New Iranian period.

The presentation examines several distinctive features of Judeo-Hamadani and reviews recent research to clarify its language origins. The presentation draws on new materials recorded during fieldwork conducted in Hamadan from October 2018 to August 2019 and in Yazd in 2017. This updated research sheds light on the historical and linguistic developments of Judeo-Hamadani and contributes to a better understanding of the preservation of vernacular languages of Jews in Iran.
