

Taube Prizes for Student Writing in Hebrew and Jewish Studies

The Oxford Centre for Hebrew and Jewish Studies (OCHJS) is pleased to announce the opening of submissions for 1 Taube Prize for Student Writing in Hebrew and Jewish Studies, generously funded by Taube Philanthropies. Current Master's and DPhil students at the University of Oxford across Faculties working on any topic in Hebrew and/or Jewish Studies may each submit one written work—an essay, article, thesis/dissertation chapter, etc.—of a minimum length of 3,000 words and a maximum length of 5,000 words to the OCHJS for consideration by the committee. The candidate with the most original and promising written work will be awarded a prize of £1,000.

To apply, please submit a completed application form along with your written work—**together as a single PDF**—to the Academic Registrar, Ms Madeleine Trivasse, at registrar@ochjs.ac.uk.

The deadline for submissions is Friday 22 May 2026 (Week 4) at 12 noon UK time.

The results will be announced in Week 7 and an award ceremony will take place at 11am on Thursday 18 June (Week 8) of Trinity Term at the OCHJS.
